Oct. 22: Buika, a native of Palma de Mallorca whose parents hail from Equatorial Guinea (she was born María Concepción Balboa Buika), sings an alluring combination of flamenco, soul, jazz, and blues. Her 2006 album, "Mi Niña Lola," made her a star at home (it garnered its producer, Javier Limón, top honors at Spain's version of the Grammys, the Premios de la Música), and she and the pianist Chucho Valdés (who is at Jazz at Lincoln Center this week) recently recorded "El Último Trago," a tribute to the Mexican singer Chavela Vargas. She performs the deeply passionate songs here with assistance from Iván (Melon) Lewis, on piano, Dany Noé, on double bass, and Fernando Favier, on percussion. Limón is a special guest.
